


# Methodology

This poll of 600 likely general election voters in Florida was conducted between July 31 and August 1, 2010.


All interviews were conducted via telephone by professional interviewers. Interview selection was random within predetermined election units. These units were structured to correlate with actual voter turnout in a general election.

The poll of 600 likely general election voters has an accuracy of +/- 4.0% at a 95% confidence interval.

Would you be willing to pay more in energy prices if the State passed renewable energy programs that would make us more energy independent, reduce our dependency on oil and create new jobs in Florida?







## “Coal”


