

## Bills for consideration of veto override during organizational session on Nov. 16<sup>th</sup>

HB 545

General Residential Property Sales: Repeals provision requiring disclosures of residential property windstorm mitigation ratings to purchasers in wind-borne debris regions. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 981

General Agriculture: Clarifies that land classified as agricultural retains that classification when offered for sale; provides methodology for assessing certain structures & improvements used for horticultural production; authorizes FWCC to enter into agreement with DEP for uniform regulation of pesticides applied to waters of state; revises exemptions from water pollution permits; provides permits for applying pesticides to waters of state; requires DEP to enter into agreements with DOACS & FWCC for uniform regulation of pesticides applied to waters of state; authorizes temporary deviations from certain DEP rule provisions for certain pesticides; requires DOACS to enter into agreement with DEP for uniform regulation of pesticides applied to waters of state; provides that Citrus Research & Development Foundation shall provide advice to DOACS with respect to citrus research marketing orders, conduct citrus research, & perform other duties assigned by DOACS; provides for deposit of certain agricultural assessments; revises assessment rate on citrus fruit; expands type of research projects that may be conducted by DOACS; revises location of executive offices of Department of Citrus; requires DOACS & representatives of state pest control industry to submit report to Legislature; requires that report include recommendations for changes in law to provide for disciplinary action against licensees of pest control industry under certain circumstances. Effective Date: July 1, 2010

SB 1516

General State-owned Lands [WPSC]; Requires the property appraiser to physically inspect any parcel of state-owned real property upon the request of the taxpayer or owner. Requires the DMS to maintain an automated inventory of all facilities owned, leased, rented, or otherwise occupied or maintained by any agency of the state, the judicial branch, or a water management district. Implements the comprehensive state-owned real property system, etc. APPROPRIATION: \$320,000. EFFECTIVE DATE: Upon becoming

HB 1565

General Rulemaking: Requires each agency, before adopting, amending, or repealing certain rules, to prepare statement of estimated regulatory costs of proposed rule if proposed rule has adverse impacts on small business or increases regulatory costs; provides exception to circumstances under which emergency rule shall not be effective, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

SB 1842

General Transportation Projects [CPSC]; Directs the DOT to notify certain property owners and local governmental entities of certain proposed projects before finalizing the design of certain transportation projects. Provides a timeframe for notification. Requires the department to hold a public hearing and receive public input regarding the effects of the project on local business, etc. EFFECTIVE DATE: 07/01/2010.

HB 5603

General Department of Financial Services: Revises duties of Division of Consumer Services; revises criteria for premiums charged to agencies & departments for purposes of State Risk Management Trust Fund; revises reporting requirements on state insurance program; requires Division of Risk Management to analyze & report on certain agency return-to-work programs & activities; requires certain agencies to establish & maintain return-to-work programs for certain employees, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2010

HB 5611

General Review of the Department of Management Services Under the Florida Government Accountability Act: Revises governance of DMS; provides for electronic filing & transmission procedures for certain actions, proceedings, & petitions; requires petitioner requesting administrative hearing to include petitioner's e-mail address; requires attorney to use electronic means when filing document with Division of Administrative Hearings; provides requirements for use of wireless communication devices by agency employees, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2010, except as otherwise provided

HB 1385

General Petroleum Contamination Site Cleanup: Requires DEP to utilize natural attenuation monitoring strategies to transition sites into long-term natural attenuation monitoring & evaluate certain costs & strategies; prohibits local governments from denying building permits under specified conditions; establishes low-scored site initiative; requires DEP to issue certain determinations & orders; provides funding for payment of preapproved costs; deletes provisions relating to funding for limited interim soil-source removals & nonreimbursable voluntary cleanup; requires installation of fuel tank upgrades to secondary systems to be completed by specified deadlines; provides exception. Effective Date: July 1, 2010

HB 569

General Solid Waste Disposal: Authorizes disposal of yard trash at Class I landfill if landfill has system for collecting landfill gas & arranges for reuse of gas; requires DEP to develop & adopt methodology to award recycling credit for such use; requires landfill to obtain minor permit modification to its operating permit before receiving yard trash; specifies which entities of local government may accept incidental amounts of yard trash at landfill; provides applicability. Effective Date: July 1, 2010

- Also on the list is a possible veto override of the appropriation for Shands Teaching Hospital at the University of Florida.
- Two other issues might be to push back the implementation date on septic tanks which will allow time for a thorough vetting during the regular session. Also, might see funding for the rebates for air conditioning for those who have already participated in the program.
- Finally, with regard to Medicaid there is the possibility to lay down a set of principles relating to potential changes to the Medicaid program in future sessions. Could potentially be a resolution or memorial.
